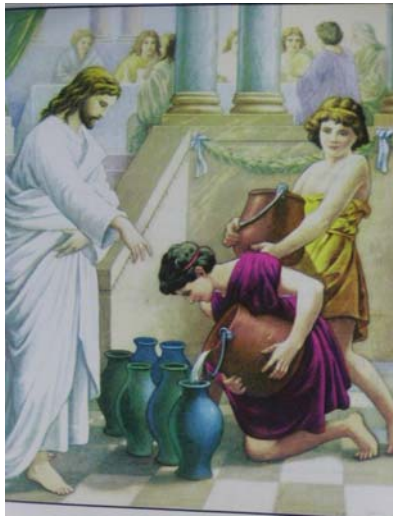
January 17, 2010

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings: Isa 62:1-5; 1 Cor 12:4-11; John 2:1-11

“Do what He tells you”

Jesus, his mother Mary, and the disciples are invited to a wedding in Cana. It is a very joyful celebration and the party runs out of wine. Mary notices the embarrassment of the couple and she informs Jesus, who apparently disregards His mother’s information. Mary tells the servants to ask Jesus what they should



do. Jesus tells them to fill the jars with water and bring them to the master. The water turns into wine and the party continues. Jesus wasn’t ready to start his miracles for a social event, but at the request of Mary, he consented. Mary is a good person to invite at our “celebrations”... She has sharp eyes and lot of power.

St. Paul reminds us that every human and spiritual gift is given by the Holy Spirit and it is “activated” by the same Spirit. The challenge for us today is to be aware of our gifts and to be ready to use them to help others.
