Donations for Haiti

Last Sunday collection to help the people of Haiti was very good, \$1,701. Donations for Haiti are still accepted. People are in desperate need of food, water and medical supplies. Many thousands volunteers from around the world are helping the survivors, looking for the victims and offering help wherever

needed. One archbishop, many priests, sisters and students were among the victims of the earthquake. The news reports that over 225,000 people were injured by the earthquake. Please, keep the victims, the survivors and the volunteers in your prayer. Over a million people are homeless.

The Scalabrini Fathers have 4 priests, and several students in the seminary in the earthquake area. The priests and students escaped safely, but the seminary building was badly damaged. They also have a medical clinic, built with the help of volunteers from Italy. The Scalabrini Fathers have 12 Haitian priests serving Haitian migrants in our country and elsewhere. Please keep them in your prayer. Any financial help is greatly appreciated. The Fathers assure us that all donations received will be used first to help the people in need and later in the second phase they will plan to repair or rebuild the seminary. I don’t know where the priests and seminarians are staying right now, but I am sure they are helping the homeless people in the city.
