Acts 10:34-43; Col 3:1-4; John 20:1-9

Alleluia! Jesus lives in us!

Very early Easter Sunday morning Mary Magdalene goes to the tomb and she discovers that the stone covering the tomb is rolled away. She runs to tell Peter and John who race to the tomb. They see the shroud and the burial cloths in the tomb but not his body. Peter enters the tomb and is puzzled. John suddenly intuits that Jesus is risen, as He had promised. Later in the day Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene and tells her to inform his disciples.

The resurrection is Jesus exodus, his liberation from death into life. It is also the pledge of our exodus, our own liberation from death into eternal life.

Personal reflections: Easter 2011

At Easter time and through the year we proclaimed Jesus “The Lamb of God who took away the sin of the world”. What do we mean by “sin of the world? Did Jesus take away a particular sin that does not exist any longer? There are more sins now than at Jesus’ time. What is the “sin of the world”? “The sin of the world” is disobedience, distrust and doubt of God’s wisdom, power and love.

Jesus accepted to die in obedience to God and he experienced resurrection and is the model of obedience and trust in God for any believer. By his example Jesus took away any reason to doubt, to distrust and to disobey God, and he gave us every reason to trust and to obey God who is ready to do for us what he did for Jesus.



HAPPY EASTER!

This “sin of the world” is not taken away from us automatically by baptism or any other sacrament, neither is the process of obedience and trust in God given to us automatically by baptism or other sacraments. To obey and to trust God is a personal choice that we make with the help of God as we develop our faith and trust in him and gradually grow to spiritual maturity.

The glaring presence of the “sin of the world” in us and in others reveals the immaturity of our faith and trust in God and how the “doubting Thomas” has become legions. We all admire and honor Jesus’ as a hero, but our admiration is not sufficient to motivate us to follow his example. And so “the sin of the world” is still present and flourishing.

Easter is a good time to rise to new life with Jesus and to pray for all who long for liberation and freedom in the service of God.
