“Practice what you preach”

When preachers do not practice what they preach Jesus first urges respect for their office and to take to heart what they teach, but not to imitate the way they live. Jesus undercuts the conventional pyramidal models of authority and obedience by asserting that in a community of equal disciples of brothers and sisters there is no one who occupies the place of sole authoritative teacher, father or master. In such a community greatness is evident through service. In Jesus’ community of disciples, there is no room for ostentatious displays of piety.

Tuesday, November 1, 2011: Feast of all Saints: A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION



Masses are: 11:30 am and 6:30 evening.

The evening mass will include a memorial of All Faithful departed for those who cannot attend the All Souls Mass November 2.

The liturgy of the feast of All Saints teaches us that we all are equally beloved children of God and that this love and membership to the family of God is a present reality, not something that will come later. Likewise, the Gospel Beatitudes affirms that holiness is evident here and now and those who live their faith already experience the happiness that will be brought to completion at the end time.

Wednesday, November 2, 2011: Commemoration of the Faithful Departed

Mass is at 11:30 AM

In today’s gospel Jesus proclaims that it is his Father’s will that “everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life”. This means that for those who believe in Jesus, eternal life has already begun in the act of faith in Jesus and will last forever. The resurrection of Jesus is the preview and guarantee of our future resurrection. It is a consoling thought as we remember our loved ones that they are in the “Father’s house” praying for us.

During all masses in November we remember parishioners who died this past year and were buried at Holy Rosary and elsewhere and all those listed in the All Souls envelopes that are placed on the altar. Donations received will be used to celebrated masses for them during the following year.

Feast of St. Charles Borromeo

St. Charles Borromeo. (1538-1584) is the patron of the Scalabrini Missionaries. He was cardinal of Milan, reformer, founder of seminaries. Bishop Scalabrini chose Charles Borromeo as the patron and model of his religious community because Charles was a model pastor, cardinal of Milan, very much involved in the Council of Trent, in the implementations of the Council’s directives and especially the development of the Tridentine Catechism. Scalabrini (1836-1905) was recognized by Pope John Paul II as the apostle of the catechism. Please, remember the Scalabrini Missionaries in your prayer this week.
